PROGRAMS FOR DAY CAMPS

Half and full day options available

Instincts for Survival

By assuming the role of wild animals, participants will examine predator/prey relationships, the flow of energy through food chains and adaptations of various animals for survival.

Keeping Track of Wildlife

Participants become nature detectives to investigate wildlife at Tiffin. This program focuses on wildlife tracking, seasonal adaptations and animal habitats.

Orienteering

The Tiffin Centre offers a comprehensive orienteering program for all ages and levels. Call for details.

Snowshoeing & Kick Sleds

After a brief introduction to the history and techniques of these traditional winter sports, students will trek or glide through a winter wonderland with an instructor. Weather dependent.

Team Dynamics & Low Ropes Challenge Course

Students will be challenged to work together to succeed at various group tasks that build in complexity as they make their way through our low ropes course. This program leads through a progressive range of fun, safe, co-operative games and initiatives that aim to promote teamwork, leadership, trust, communication and problem solving.

Wilderness Skills

Participants will be challenged both physically and mentally as they learn valuable life skills. Combine wilderness skills with orienteering for an exciting full day of active learning!

Maple Sugar Bush tours

Join us for an interactive, one-hour tour of a working sugar bush that demonstrates the First Nations, pioneer and modern-day methods of maple syrup production. Through hands-on activities, participants will learn the basic ecology of the maple tree and how maple syrup is made.

Morning and afternoon tour times are available.

Cost per participant: \$5 based on a minimum of 20 campers (leaders are **free**)

* Maple syrup and maple products will be available for purchase following the tour.

Campfire lunch available! Let us provide the hot dogs for \$1.00 each.

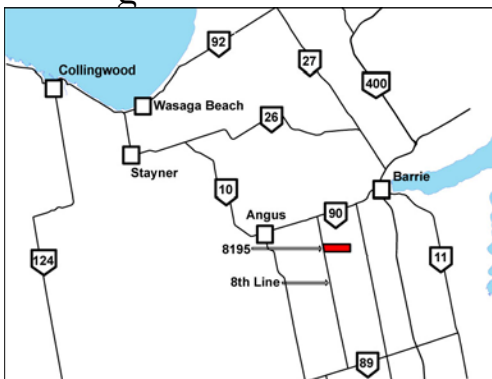
