
Springwater donates proceeds of 2010 Mayor's Golf Tournament

SPRINGWATER TOWNSHIP / April 6, 2011 – Springwater Township Council presented over \$15,000 in proceeds from the 2010 Mayor's Golf Tournament to two local organizations at the April 4th Council Meeting.

The 2010 Mayor's Golf Tournament was the fourth annual tournament, and with over 100 golfers, was the best yet, raising the largest donation to date.

This year's recipients were the Radio for Radiology Campaign and the Historic Fort Willow.

The Radio for Radiology Campaign is an initiative of Larch Communications, better known as radio stations Kicx 106 and 104.1 the Dock. President Paul Larche was on

hand Monday evening (April 4th), as well as Scott Elliott of the RVH Foundation Board to receive the funds.

The Radio for Radiology Campaign has committed itself to a donation of \$500,000 towards the Simcoe Muskoka Regional Cancer Center, and the purchase of a new Interventional Radiology Machine.

Mayor Collins presented Larche and Elliott with a donation of \$10,500 towards their pledge. Larche confirmed that with this donation, the campaign is now well over two-thirds of the way to its goal.

The Historical Fort Willow is one of Springwater's most popular attractions, and will be highlighted over the coming years as we celebrate the bicentennial of the War of 1812, in which Fort Willow played a large role.

Chair of the Friends of Historic Fort Willow Peter Monahan and Vice-Chair Richard Dixon, were joined by Byron Wesson from the Nottawasaga Valley Conservation Authority in accepting the Township's donation of \$5,250, which the Friends of Fort Willow have earmarked for use in making the walkways at the site accessible.

"I thank everyone who supported this and previous tournaments, and allowed us to support these worthy community initiatives," said Mayor Linda Collins. "Planning has begun for the 2011 tournament, to take place on August 11th at Orr Lake Golf Club."

Springwater is a municipality of approximately 18,000 residents located in the heart of Simcoe County. Springwater Township is home to the second largest concentration of County Forests and is a popular destination for outdoor activities in all four seasons.
